NLD RFU Youth Council Terms of Reference

Objectives:

Make recommendations to enable player retention of participants aged 16 – 24 via research and project-based activities.

To be a sounding board and youth insight group across the business.

To be ambassadors for the sport and attend events and conferences in their role as an NLD RFU Youth Council member

To aid with the development of the Young Rugby Ambassador programme to ensure it is valuable and realistic, engaging with current and past players.

Membership, Meetings and Quorum:

- 1.1 The NLD RFU Youth Council (NLD RFU YC) shall be comprised of a select group of members, serving a 2 year term. A Chairperson, Treasurer, Secretary and Social Media members will be appointed from the group. New members will be appointed by the current members.
- 1.2 The NLD RFU YC shall have the power to invite people to attend meetings as and when required, whether they are providing expertise or for any other suitable purpose.
- 1.3 A member of the NLD RFU YC may resign with immediate effect by giving written notice to the Chairperson. The NLD RFU Volunteer Coordinators may remove a member from the NLD RFU YC by giving written notice to the member which shall have immediate effect
- 1.4 The NLD RFU YC shall meet no fewer than four times per year at a location decided by all members.
- 1.5 The quorum necessary for a scheduled meeting to take place will be seven.
- 1.6 In the event that a vote is held and the vote is tied, the Chairperson shall have the deciding vote.

Terms of Reference:

1. Oversee and advise on player and volunteer recruitment and retention programmes for 16 – 24 year olds in rugby.
2. Provide support and insights to the relevant Sub Committees and other colleagues on engagement with and retention and recruitment of 16 – 24 year olds in rugby.
3. Assist the development of a Club Support Strategy encompassing “off-field” club activity, with particular emphasis on the retention and recruitment of 16 – 24 year olds in rugby.
4. Research and report on the numbers of young people (aged 16 – 24 years old) in positions of influence on club and NLD RFU committees.
5. Collate and produce a quarterly report, detailing the progress of the previous year and future objectives for the next 12 months.
6. Act as an ambassador for the game at all times promoting the core values of the sport throughout the Community Game as an aid to participation and retention.
