Detailed report of the incident

The incident started off a line out, the ball came off the top to the Amber Valley 9 that then ran at the back of the line out and the Amber Valley 8 moved back as the ran passes and was blocking, I had blown the whistle for blocking.

There was 3 Bakewell player then around the Amber Valley's 9 trying to get the ball after the whistle had gone one of these players was number 6. The Amber Valley player hadn't released the ball the 3 players around the 9 was pulling the ball that's when about 5 Amber Valley players came in pushing and shoving to get them off their player, as they hadn't listened to the whistle.

The Amber Valley 1 clawed at the Bakewell 6 face, so that's when I saw the Bakewell 6 punch at the Amber Valley 1 player head as a retaliation to the clawing his face, the Amber Valley player then punched him in the head.

A few pushing and shoving happened after but then broke up after, I then had both captain's and players and said that was unacceptable behaviour and with the punches, that both were receiving red cards due to strikes to the heads.

No injuries had occurred due to the incident, the game carried on from the penalty that was awarded before the incident.

After the game it took 25-30 minuets for me to get the Amber Valley players name as I couldn't find the coach and the captain was slow coming upstairs.
