Schools Link Charter

The schools link programme is focused around increasing rugby participation in Schools.

The programme aims to build links between local schools and clubs by increasing rugby provision in primary and Secondary schools across the three counties.

Encourage schools to sign up to a short-term rugby programme where Clubs will source coaches and provide equipment to run the sessions/festivals.

Opportunities for clubs to promote rugby and themselves to the pupils / parents to encourage player transition from school to club rugby.



 - Always end with a festival









Ensure your club information is accurate on FINDRUGBY.COM




CLUB UNIVERSITY LINKS KEY FACTORS FOR SUCCESS

- Limit your expectations regarding quality of players and availability.
- Remember the University is a club probably the largest adult clubs in the 3 counties and has a full playing Programme
- Be realistic Consider travel time to your club
- What is your clubs welcome experience like?
- Raise awareness through a social media campaign flyers don't do it.
- Is your Website vibrant and up to date.
- Facebook as above
- Appropriate social events

Tag & Touch rugby training







- The RFU plan to launch non-contact rugby in schools to offer an alternative format of the game and avoid any safety concerns of teachers, children, and parents.
- Touch rugby promotes the opportunity of mixed sport that is intuitive and easy to run.
- RFU potential to run Touch/Tag training sessions in May/June so that teachers are prepared to coach in schools from September 2024.
- Touch training sessions for teachers in Nottinghamshire ahead of the Touch World Cup, to be held
 15-21st July 2024 hosted at the University of Nottingham's Highfields Sports Complex
- Once training dates are confirmed, the Schools Links team will promote to the Schools Games
 Organisers throughout Nottinghamshire, Lincolnshire, and Derbyshire.
