NLD – Community Rugby Options

It is proposed to offer 2 game solutions for NLD based community rugby **A Structured Season**

A structured season that is designed for Clubs who desire to and will be able to field a game squad on a weekly basis similar to that required by RFU Leagues.

Social rugby opportunities

Ad hoc playing opportunities – i.e. fortnightly or monthly fixtures – for Clubs who wish to provide playing opportunities for more senior players, colts advancing to senior rugby or excess players from other high squads who are not playing weekly whom they wish to retain.

There will be a review of both opportunities in the lead up to Christmas to develop ongoing engagement for the second half of the season.



NLD – Community Rugby Options

The Structured Season – The NLD Merit Leagues

- There will be 2 Tiers of Leagues
- Each Tier will have an East and West League
- Each League (of which there will be 4) will have 8 Teams for Tier 1 and
 7 Teams for Tier 2
- There will be 14 playing weekends
- Teams in Tier 1 will play 14 games and Tier 2 will play 12 games
- Teams in Tier 2 will have 2 'bye' weekends
- There will be 5 reserve weekends, not including the Christmas Break, to permit recovery of games lost to weather conditions etc.
- To provide Teams a 22 week season between Merit League and Conference fixtures

NLD - Mid-Season Review

This is designed to recognise that the dynamics for Clubs engaged in grassroots rugby are fluid throughout the season and permit an opportunity to reflect that in the NLD's game offering.

This will include:

- The splitting into Conferences for the Top 10 Clubs of Tier 1 to offer more challenging fixtures
- Similar Conferences for the remaining Tier 1 and 2 Teams to permit wider challenges
- Permit those Clubs whose teams have struggled with the more structured season to play more social fixtures.
- Permit those Social Clubs who have developed more structure fixtures; i.e. inclusion in the 2nd tier of conferences noted above or conferences of similar level Clubs.
- Consolidate Cup Competition Structure which will potentially use reserve weekends from the Conference period to facilitate.



NLD – Community Rugby Options

The Social Rugby Opportunities

- This could be clubs arranging ad hoc games in agreement with other similarly engaged clubs
- Clubs can organise Cluster Fixtures
- Organised 'Rugby Fests' can be organised
- This will be a self-managed arrangement supported by the Social Team Organiser from the Competitions Committee
- It will be possible to create a WhatsApp group dedicated to act as a 'clearing house' for Clubs to organise fixtures managed by the Social Team Organiser.



NLD Principles of the Community Game

All games will be played under the Game On principles

All games will be subject to the NLD Rules and Regulations for the Merit Leagues

Clubs will be expected to enter results using the RFU Match Card system

Issues with fixture fulfilment and result entry must be communicated to the Fixtures Secretary – email TBC
